This lid of a canopic jar was made to look like a falcon's head, thus representing Qebehsenuef. Jars with lids of this type usually held the intestines. Other fragments of canopic jars were discovered in tomb S.7C/82 located in the same chapel. The fine craftsmanship of the lid points to the high status of the person it was intended for. It has been assigned putatively to the assemblage of grave goods belonging to the Vizier Padiamonet.
